I first worked with Richard in 2000, on the Canada Post Corporation (CPC) Business Transformation (BT) project – a multi-million dollar, mission critical strategic initiative for the corporation.

Richard's role was the Chief Technology Architect (CTA), where he was responsible for the selection of technology and the design of each solution to ensure integration into the overall SAP landscape.

Of the over 40 distinct and diverse technologies implemented to support various business requirements, the Enterprise Application and Integration (EAI) component was perhaps the most complex.

In that role I was responsible for the development of a cross-sector, department-wide Enterprise Architecture (EA) framework supported by a 5 years Investment Plan framework.

Richard's reputation in this area is beyond reproach – he is recognized as one of Canada's premier Enterprise Architects and is a highly sought after IT





professional. I was able to retain his services to help deliver the new EA Framework for PWGSC. He worked closely with various direct reports, key stakeholders and numerous subject matter experts to create the vision for departmental service transformation.
